You will be asked to confirm the following statement:

How did you first find out about this opportunity?

Choose your response from the dropdown menu list. This is optional to select or keep blank.

There is another comment box that will ask you to provide more details about the chosen communication channel, if relevant (for example: which social media account, a specific event, or a particular website). This is optional to comment or keep blank.

You will be asked to tick the tick box for the following statement:

I am / the organisation is aware of Creative Australia's First Nations Protocols and agree to adhere to them as a condition of funding.

Application

You may respond in written form, video, or audio. Please type 'Refer to support material' in the comment box and attach your video or audio file to the Support Material section below.

For video, you may provide up to 10 minutes (MP4 and Windows Media)

For Audio, you may provide up to 10 minutes (MP3 and Windows Media).

Please note: The Project Viability questions must be written responses only.

About you

You will be asked to provide a brief description of your artistic practice in no more than 2,400 characters.



Please consider sharing your:

- First Nations background and connections to country lands
- if you are an emerging or a mid-career artist
- artistic practice and arts-related education history
- major achievements, awards, and accolades
- any major collaborations/partnerships with artists/organisations or on previous projects

Project Title

You will be asked to provide the title of your project in no more than 100 characters.

Please consider:

 being straightforward about the title so it is clear to the assessor, for example, 'First Nations writers retreat at Varuna' or 'Attendance at First Nations International Writers Exchange'.

Please note: If you are successful, this title will be displayed along with your project description, image, and short bio as part of the recipient's information that will be displayed on the Elevate: First Nation Storytelling and Literature Fund webpage.

Project Description

You will be asked to provide a summary of your professional/career development opportunity (800 characters or less).

Please consider sharing your:

- project idea/vision, if it is a residency, say the name and where it is going to be held
- project phase/stage that you are applying for, for example, is it a creative development or the final phase of a published book
- length of the project delivery, for example, 1-3 months, 3-6 months, or 6-12 months
- outcome of the project

Assessment Criteria

Project Quality

You will be asked about your Activity: Tell us about your career development opportunity, outlining what you want to do, the creative rationale, and the activity involved in no more than 5,600 characters.

Please consider the Five W's:



- **Who** is involved and what are their roles?
- What is the project about? What are the key steps in delivering this project?
- When will this project be occurring? Is there a specific date? Or will it be in durations of months, e.g., 3-6 period or 6-12 period?
- Where will the project be delivered? Is there a venue that you can name? Or will the majority of the work happen at home?
- Why is it important that you apply for funding for this project now?

Project Impact

You will be asked about the project's significant impact on your artistic practice, skills, and career development.

Please consider the various impact/s this project will have, including but not limited to:

- The benefits of doing this professional/career development project
- The motivation and urgency for applying now
- How will the outcome of this project improve your professional and career development?

Project Viability

You will be asked if you are working with other artists or creatives.

Choose Yes or No from the dropdown menu.

If yes, then you will need to provide names, emails, roles, and if they are confirmed (Yes/No).

Activity Details

You will be asked to provide your project start and end dates.

To be eligible for this funding initiative, your project start date must be on or after 1 December 2025, and the end date must be completed within 1 year of your start date.

For example, start date - 1 December 2025 and end date - 30 November 2026

You will be asked to provide proposed specific dates of what activities you will be delivering during the start and end dates.

• Information required includes the activity name, start and end dates, a check box to confirm the activity is confirmed, where the activity is taking place, venue name, state, and Electorate.

Consider adding all your major timeline milestones that you think the assessor should know about in terms of delivering your project. This could be:

Planning and preparation



- Writing period/s
- Mentorship, Residency, and training dates
- Stakeholder Engagement for consultations and meetings/interviews with Elders, artists, or organisations
- Travel and Accommodation dates
- Acquittal Report

Main location of activity

You will be asked where the main location of your activity will be held.

Choose Australia or International from the dropdown menu and fill in the required information.

Your Budget

Use the green + icon to add your Income & In-kind and Expenses.

Income & In-kind

Income contribution may include:

- Your project income
- Sponsorship money
- Fundraising
- Ticket sales
- Other funding grants that have been confirmed or unconfirmed

<u>In-kind</u> contributions are any form of good or service that equates to a monetary value, this may include:

- Donated goods for the project
- Donated services for the project
- Voluntary services for the project

Please note: Adding your own income and/or in-kind is optional.

If you don't have income or in-kind, then just leave the income and in-kind blank.

Expenses

When adding your expenses, please be as detailed as possible.

Please consider when filling out your budget expenses, such as:

Your artist fees for yourself and others involved in your project



- Living costs if you are planning to take time off work and dedicate your time to your project
- Aboriginal Protocols:
 - Fees for engaging First Nations Elders, community consultations
 - Fees for Welcome to Country (speaker, songman, didge player, and dancers' fees)
 - Indigenous Cultural Intellectual Property (ICIP)
- Editor and publisher fees for work or consultations
- Creative team staff to deliver the project
- Mentor fees
- Masterclass/residencies/ Training course for skills development
- Materials required
- Traveling and accommodation costs
- Project research Fees
- conference or festival attendance registration fees
- Other costs like contingency

Important Note: You must add the funding amount request in the Expense section to cover Creative Australia's Funding request.

Budget Summary

 - Letters of Confirmation can come from individual artists or organisations that can confirm their involvement and role in their project
