Who this book is for

This book is for people who want to ask us for a **grant**.



A grant is money we give you to help you do an arts project.

About this book



This book is about the grant called **Arts Projects for Individuals and Groups**.



Application means the form you fill out on our website to

- ask us for the grant
- tell us how you will use the grant money.




You can ask us about different ways to do your application if

you speak a language that is **not** English, including Auslan



 you have a disability that makes it hard to read or write.

About the grant



You can ask us for money to help you do an arts project.



You can ask us for any amount of money from \$10,000 to \$50,000.



We can **not** give the grant to everyone who asks us.

What is an arts project?



An arts project might be when you

make a new artwork



work with an artist



show your art to other people



show your art in different places



improve your skills



write a book.



You can take up to 2 years to finish your project.

Who can ask for the grant?



You can ask for the grant if you are

an artist

or



an arts worker.



You must be

born in Australia

or

allowed to live in Australia forever.



You can ask for the grant

for one person

or



for a group.

Who can not ask for the grant?




You can **not** ask for the grant if

- you need to give us a report on another grant
- you owe us money.

When can you ask for the grant?



The dates you can apply are on our website.



We can help you until 3 o'clock on these dates.

How to ask for the grant



You need to do 4 things.

1. Fill out an application



You need to fill out an application on our website.


Things you must tell us in the application are

• the name of your project



• what your project is about

information about you



• when you will do your project



• how much your project will cost.

2. Choose who will read your application

You must choose your assessment panel.



Assessment panel means a group of artists and arts workers who will

read your application



• decide if you get the grant money.



We can help you choose your assessment panel.

Assessment panels



The assessment panels you can choose from are

- Community Arts and Cultural Development
- Dance



• Emerging and Experimental Arts



Literature



Multi-art form



• Music



Theatre




Visual Arts



- First Nations Arts and Culture
 - you must be a First Nations person to choose this panel.

3. Answer assessment criteria



You must answer 3 assessment criteria.




Assessment criteria means the information we use to decide if your project should get a grant.

The assessment criteria you must use are

1. Quality



Quality means you tell us about your artwork and ideas.



You might tell us about

- what you have done as an artist
- ⋄ what your project is about



how good your art is



what people say about your art.

2. Viability



Viability means how well you plan your project.



You might tell us about

what skills you have to do your project



how much money you have to do your project



- how you will follow information about the right way to
 - work with First Nations artists



pay artists



· work with children



• be safe during COVID-19.

We can help you find this information.





You must choose the last of the 3 selection criteria.



We can help you choose.



You can choose

 Australians are transformed by arts and creativity



This means you tell us what your project will be like for Australians who are in the audience or take part.



For example, you might tell us how your project will

⋄ be exciting and new



make people feel emotions





get people to take part who do not usually take part in the arts.

Or you can choose

Our arts reflect us




This means you tell us how your project will include people from different backgrounds



For example, you might tell us how your project will include

people from different cultures




people who live in regional areas



people with disability



First Nations people



young people



ways to bring people together.

Or you can choose

 First Nations arts and culture are cherished



This means you tell us how your project will involve First Nations art led by First Nations people.



For example, you might tell us how your project will involve First Nations

◊ artists



⋄ communities


- ◊ leaders



- young people
- global networks
- audiences.

Or you can choose

Arts and creativity are thriving



This means you tell us how your project will be good for the arts.



For example, you might tell us your project will

help you be a better artist



make exciting new art



♦ build skills



help people make money from art



- share art with people overseas
- ⋄ share art in new ways



help you work with other people or organisations.

4. Send us support material on our website



You can give us **support material** with your application.



Support material means other things to help us decide if you get the grant.



We can help you choose the support material you give us.



Do **not** send us support material in the post.



You should give us support material on our website.



There are 3 types of support material you can give us.

1. Artist information



Artist information means you tell us about

- you
- other artists you work with.

This should **not** be more than 2 pages long.





Letters of support means a letter from someone who wants your project to happen.



A letter of support could be from

- another artist
- an arts worker



an organisation that knows your work



a First Nations community or Elder.



You can give us 5 letters of support.

3. Artistic support material



Artistic support material means you show us examples of your artwork.



This helps the assessment panel know what your project is about.



You can send us 3 links to examples of your work that are on a website. We call these links **URLs**.



The 3 URLs could link to

video or sound that goes for 10 minutes



• 10 pictures



10 pages of something you wrote.




If you can **not** give us URLs you can ask us about other ways to show us your work.
